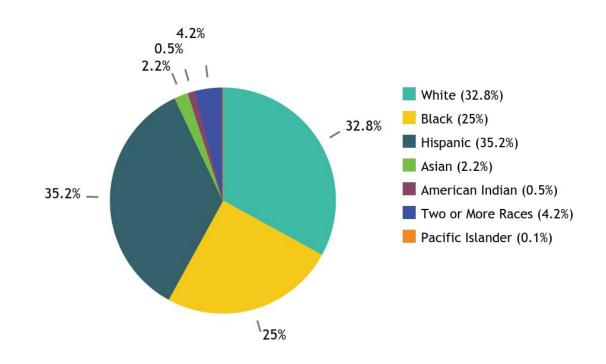

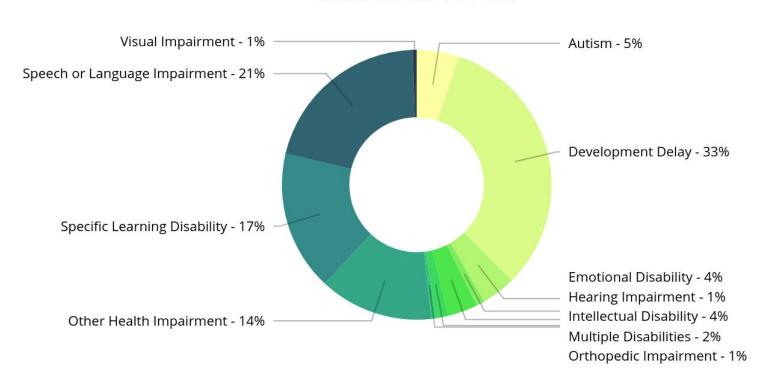

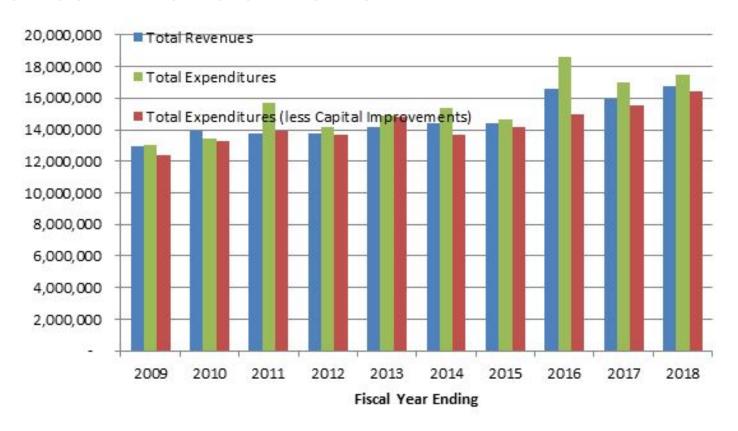

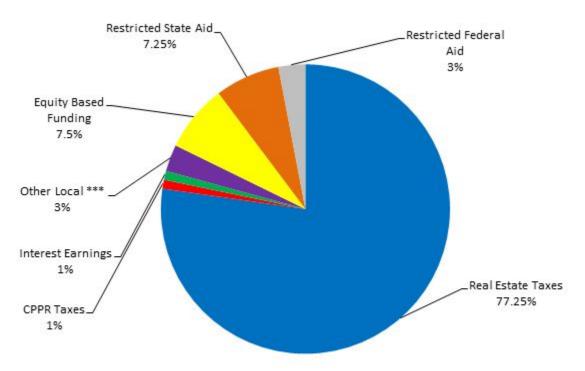

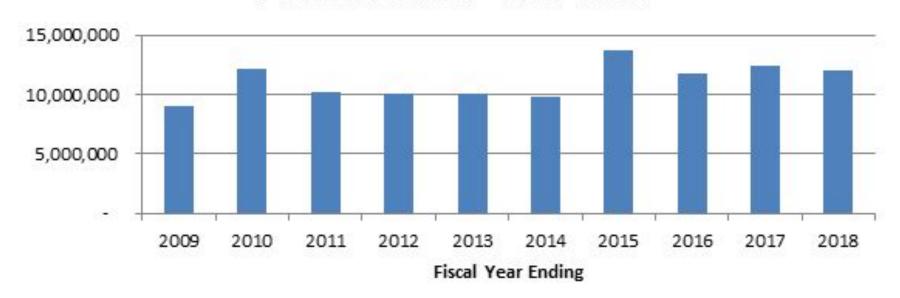
Breakdown of Revenues - 2018



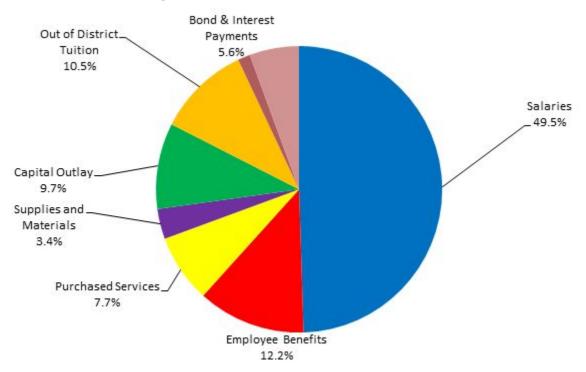

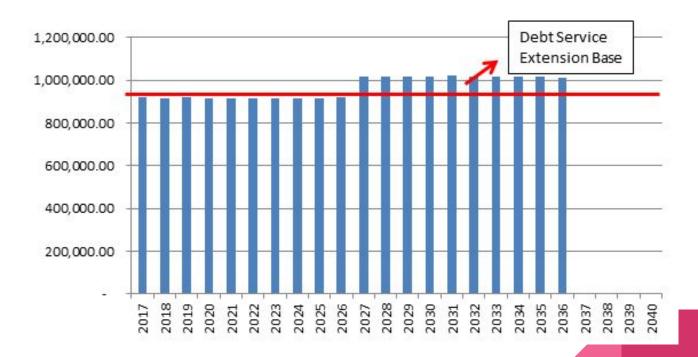
Fund Balances - All Funds

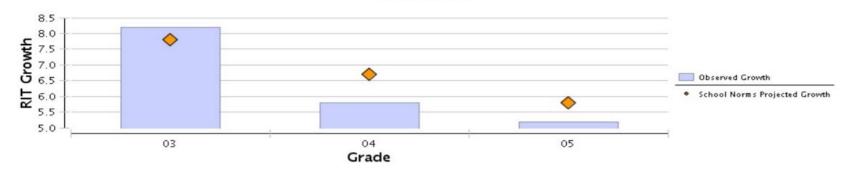

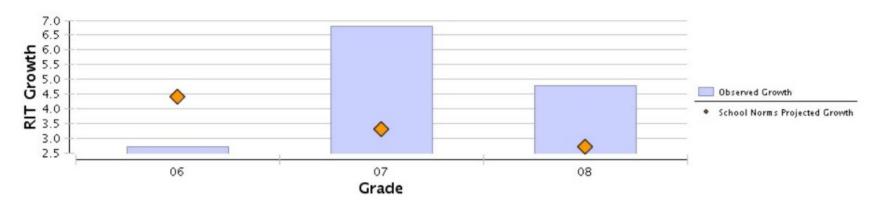

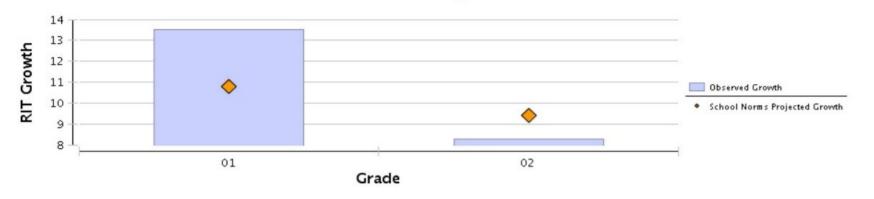

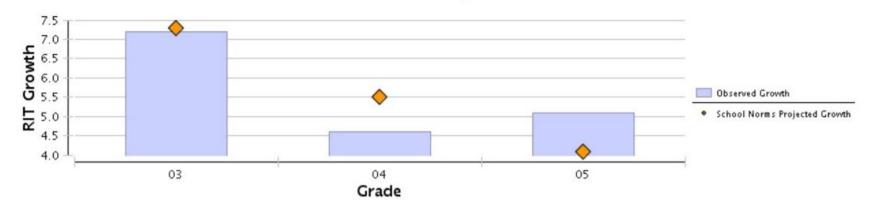

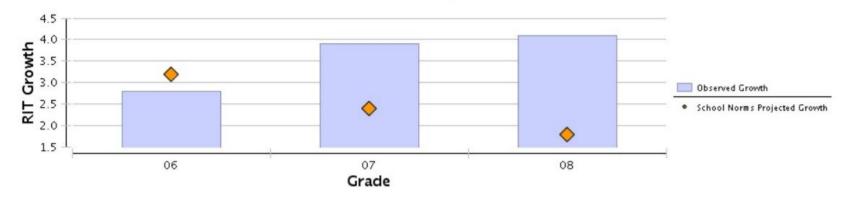

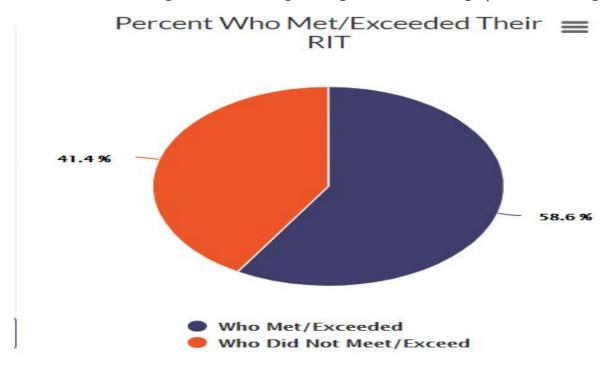

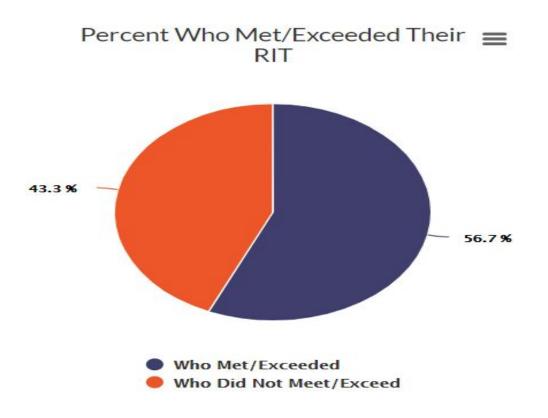
